MARKET ANNOUNCEMENT

Quotation Application

Under the Corporations Act, the Company was required to file an application for the shares offered under its IPO Prospectus dated 3 April 2007 (**Prospectus**) to be admitted to quotation on ASX (the **Quotation Application**) within 7 days of the date of the Prospectus.

The Easter holidays fell during this 7 day period but there is no allowance for public holidays under the Corporations Act in this matter.

The Company lodged the Quotation Application 8 days after lodgment of the Prospectus (on Wednesday, 11 April 2007).

The Company filed an application (**Application**) with the Federal Court of Australia (Western Australia District Registry) seeking an extension of time in order to comply with the requirements of the Corporations Act in this regard.

The Federal Court Application was heard before Justice French on 8 May 2007 in Perth.

On 9 May 2007, Justice French made orders granting the Application (as attached).
